The African Wildlife Foundation (AWF), in partnership with the Rwanda Development Board (RDB), is implementing a comprehensive conservation and development program for the Volcanoes landscape in Rwanda. This initiative aims to harmonize conservation efforts with sustainable community development, addressing the complex challenges faced by both the ecosystem and local populations.

As part of this program, AWF has identified poultry farming as a promising income-generating activity for local communities. This aligns with the broader goals of reducing pressure on natural resources, diversifying livelihoods, and promoting sustainable economic development in the region. However, the current skill level within this value chain among local community members is relatively low.

Terms of Reference: Poultry Expert for Community-Based Poultry Farm Establishment and Management

1. Background

The African Wildlife Foundation (AWF), in partnership with the Rwanda Development Board (RDB), is implementing a comprehensive conservation and development program for the Volcanoes landscape in Rwanda. This initiative aims to harmonize conservation efforts with sustainable community development, addressing the complex challenges faced by both the ecosystem and local populations.

As part of this program, AWF has identified poultry farming as a promising income-generating activity for local communities. This aligns with the broader goals of reducing pressure on natural resources, diversifying livelihoods, and promoting sustainable economic development in the region. However, the current skill level within this value chain among local community members is relatively low.

To address this gap and catalyze the development of a robust poultry sector, AWF plans to establish a small-scale poultry farm that will serve multiple purposes:

- -1. Act as a demonstration and training center for best practices in poultry farming
- 2. Provide hands-on learning opportunities for community members
- 3. Serve as an income-generating facility for the community
- 4. Showcase various components of the poultry value chain, including hatchery operations, egg production, meat production, and packaging.

2. Objectives of the Assignment

The primary goal of this assignment is to establish, manage, and utilize a small-scale poultry farm as a catalyst for community development and capacity building in the Volcanoes landscape. The specific objectives are:

- 1. To design and establish a comprehensive small-scale poultry farm that incorporates all key components of the value chain, including hatchery, egg production, meat production, and slaughtering and packaging facilities.
- 2. To implement best practices in poultry farming, ensuring the farm serves as a model of efficiency, sustainability, and profitability.
- 3. To develop and deliver a comprehensive training program that builds the capacity of local community members in all aspects of poultry farming and management.
- 4. To manage the poultry farm operations for a period of two years, ensuring its viability and demonstrating its potential as a sustainable business model.

Scope of Work

The Poultry Expert will be responsible for the following tasks:

1. Farm Design and Establishment:

- Conduct a feasibility study and develop a detailed business plan for the poultry farm
- Design the layout and infrastructure requirements for the farm, including hatchery, egg production units, meat production facilities, and packaging area
- Oversee the construction and equipping of the farm, ensuring adherence to best practices and local regulations

2. Farm Management:

- Develop and implement standard operating procedures for all aspects of farm operations
- Manage day-to-day operations of the farm, including bird health, feed management, production schedules, and quality control
- Implement biosecurity measures to prevent disease outbreaks and ensure animal welfare
- Oversee record-keeping and data management for farm operations and finances

3. Training and Capacity Building:

- Develop a comprehensive training curriculum covering all aspects of poultry farming, from basic husbandry to advanced management techniques
- Conduct regular training sessions for community members, using the farm as a practical demonstration site
- Mentor and coach selected community members to take on management roles within the farm

4. Market Development and Linkages:

 and other poultry products
- Develop marketing strategies and establish relationships with key market players
- Assist community members in negotiating fair prices and contracts with buyers

5. Sustainability and Conservation Integration:

- Implement environmentally friendly practices in farm operations, such as waste management and efficient resource use
- Develop strategies to link poultry farming success with conservation goals, potentially including conservation agreements or education programs

6. Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting:

- Establish key performance indicators for the farm and training program
- Conduct regular monitoring and evaluation of farm performance and community skill development
- Prepare monthly progress reports and a comprehensive final report



7. Handover and Exit Strategy:

- Develop a detailed plan for the transition of farm management to the community
- Identify and train key community members to take over various aspects of farm operations
- Create a long-term sustainability plan for the farm and associated community poultry initiatives

6. Required Qualifications and Experience

- Minimum of 5 years of hands-on experience in poultry farm management
- Demonstrated experience in setting up and managing small to medium-scale poultry operations, including hatcheries, layer farms, and broiler production.
- Proven track record in developing and implementing training programs in poultry farming for rural communities.
- Experience in business planning and financial management of agricultural enterprises.
- In-depth knowledge of modern poultry farming techniques, including breeding, nutrition, disease management, and biosecurity.
- Familiarity with poultry processing and packaging operations.
- Understanding of market dynamics and value chain development in the poultry sector.

- Commitment to conservation and sustainable development principles.
- Physical office in the landscape is an added advantage
